

A BYLAW TO PROVIDE FIRE PROTECTION

The Council of the Rural Municipality of Lajord No. 128, of the Province of Saskatchewan enacts as follows:

1. It shall be lawful for the Council of the Rural Municipality of Lajord No. 128 to enter into an agreement with the Riceton Volunteer Fire Brigade, for the purpose of providing fire protection to the entire area of the Rural Municipality of Lajord No. 128 in accordance with the terms and conditions of the agreement attached hereto and to assess and levy a contribution thereof within the Rural Municipality of Lajord No. 128.
2. The Reeve and the Administrator are hereby authorized and directed to execute the said agreement on behalf of the Rural Municipality of Lajord No. 128, and to affix the seal of the municipality thereto.

READ THREE TIMES by unanimous vote and passed by the Council of the Rural Municipality of Lajord No. 128 at Lajord, in the Province of Saskatchewan this 12th day of May, 1992 A.O.

Fire Protection Agreement

This agreement made in quintuplicate this 12th day of May, A.D. 1992

Between: The Riceton Volunteer Fire Brigade, having its office at Riceton. in the Province of Saskatchewan (hereinafter referred to as the Brigade)

OF THE FIRST PART

and

The Rural Municipality of Lajord No. 128, in the Province of Saskatchewan (hereinafter referred to as the Municipality)

OF THE SECOND PART

WITNESSETH that in consideration of the mutual agreements and undertakings herein the parties hereto covenant and agree each with the other as follows:

1. The Riceton and District Fire Area (hereinafter referred to as the Area) shall cover the entire Rural Municipality of Lajord No. 128.
2. The Fire Chief of the Brigade shall be the "Chief Fire Ranger" for the area.
3. The Brigade agrees to provide fire protection services to the Area insofar as the same may reasonably be provided by the operation of its firefighting equipment.
4. The Brigade agrees to inspect and test its firefighting equipment and accessories to ensure, as far as possible, that it will be in a state of readiness for fighting fires at all times and the Brigade shall attempt to supply a sufficient number of duly qualified members to man the fire truck, who will proceed with all possible speed to any in the Area to assist in every way in fighting the fire.
5. The Brigade agrees to house the firefighting equipment and accessories free of charge for the term of this agreement.
6. The Municipality_ agrees to remit an amount equivalent to $\frac{1}{4}$ mill tax rate, less discounts, based on the taxable assessment of the Area and pay the said amount to the Brigade on or before December 31st in the year of levy during each and every year for the term of the agreement.
7. Any grants received by the Municipality because of the existence of this joint fire protection agreement shall be turned over to the Brigade. But should any new brigades come into being within the municipality, the grant shall be shared on an equal basis.

8. The fire protection service being provided to the Area shall be financed on a taxation, membership and user fee basis. The user fees shall be set by the Brigade, but in consultation with the Municipality.
9. The Brigade shall establish the rates of remuneration for members of the Fire Brigade.
10. By mutual consent the parties hereto. May develop operating procedures which shall become effective upon adoption by all parties hereto.
11. This agreement shall be continuous but by unanimous Consent of the parties hereto it may be amended or replaced by another agreement and it is further agreed that any one party may demand a new agreement every ten years by notifying the other parties hereto in writing, one hundred and twenty days prior to the end of any ten year period.
12. The first ten-year period, of this agreement shall commence from the date shown on this agreement.
