

A BYLAW TO DESIGNATE MUNICIPAL HERITAGE PROPERTY

Bylaw No. 288

A bylaw of the Rural Municipality of Lajord No. 128

To designate a site as Municipal Heritage Property

WHEREAS Sections 11 and 12 of The Heritage Property Act authorize the Council of a Municipality to enact bylaws to designate real property, including all buildings, features and structures thereon, to be of heritage value; and,

WHEREAS the Council of the Municipality has determined that the property known as: The Original SAAR School in Kronau

and located at: Lots 19 & 20, Block 1, Plan No. 59462 in Kronau, Saskatchewan

is a site of architectural, historical, cultural, environmental, archaeological, palaeontological, aesthetic and/or scientific value; and,

WHEREAS not less than thirty (30) days prior to consideration of this bylaw, the Council of the Municipality has:

- a. served a Notice of Intention on the Registrar of Heritage Property and all owners of property included in the proposed bylaw;
- b. published a Notice of Intention in at least one issue of a newspaper in general circulation in the municipality
- c. registered an interest in the Land Titles Registry against all titles for the parcels of land included in the proposed bylaw; and

WHEREAS no Notice of Objection to the proposed designation has been served on the Council of the Municipality;

THEREFORE, the Council of the Municipality enacts as follows:

There is designated as municipal Heritage Property the real property legally described as:

Lots 19 & 20, Block I, Plan No. 59462 in Kronau, Saskatchewan

The reasons for the designation are as follows:

- a. The old SAAR School building is the property of the Kronau Heritage Museum, and was relocated to the Museum grounds in 2008. This was the result of countless volunteer hours in fundraising efforts and a high level of community support to see the building moved to the Museum with the goal of its preservation and restoration.
- b. The building has an important role in the history of the community. In addition to being a school, this structure also served as a hub of the community for many activities and events for many years. Hundreds of people went through these doors to receive their early education, and have a sentimental attachment to the structure and what it represents.
- c. Old schoolhouses are a thing of the past. Many communities,

including Kronau, no longer have a school. This structure is the last remaining building of its type in the Kronau area.
